There was one addition to the agenda for Health and Welfare. Bill Holbrook reported that Robert Stevenson (S/V Coastal Lee) is in the hospital and needs blood donated.

OFFICERS REPORTS

- Treasurer's report Sandy Elterich
 - o The Club is doing well; we have received 51,750 pesos in memberships so far this year .
- Commodore's report -

Richard Tripp

- After overseeing the data base for several years Leanne Lawrence submitted her resignation as of March 15th to the Board. Richard advised that the Board accepted her resignation and is need of a volunteer to take over this position. He then thanked Leanne for all her work as membership chairman the last few years and presented her with flowers and a bottle of wine in appreciation for her work.
- We have everything we need to install the donated VHF radio donated at La Costa except for an antenna and someone to install the unit.
- o Richard reviewed the new pricing structure for Club merchandise purchased by members and non-members.
- There will soon be Wi-Fi access in the Club house for members only. Each person's individual Mack number will be entered into a data base which will allow you access to the Wi-Fi.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

• Club House Bill Holbrook

- All is going OK. The idea of adding additional shelving for the books has been tabled for now; we will be shoring up
 a couple of the shelves that are sagging. A suggestion was made of having a place to put cup hooks for people who
 bring their own coffee cups.

- Charity Teri Hagen
 - Senior Citizens' Home The Club continues to support this charity with the donation of adult diapers and lactose free milk. She asked the members to help by purchasing these items when shopping.

- Mama Bonita's Shelter Teri explained that Mama Bonita takes in people who have no place else to go; she takes in both children and adults. There have been some changes in Mexican laws in the last couple years and these changes have finally been instituted in La Paz and they are impacting this shelter. Mama Bonita has a hard time understanding the changes and what she needs to do so there are two local attorneys who are working with her. The fashion show was a huge success and the money raised from that event will be used to fix some of the problems that these new regulations have addressed. There were questions from the members on the legal status of the ownership of the house and whether there were any employees in the house. Bill Holbrook requested that a list be posted at the Club house of what all is needed at this shelter.
- o Pet Therapy Program- Jean Wise gave a report on this program at the Senior Citizen's Home. She advised that people are needed who would be willing to transport dogs from La Paz to Portland and/or Seattle. There is no cost involved for the volunteer; all expenses are paid by the dog shelter.
- FANLAP Jean also asked that members continue to support this program by donating rice, oil and beans which can be left at Marina de La Paz or Marina Palmira.
